Discover Yours: Forest's enormous spatial imaging and powerful yet controlled bass are perfectly suited for powerful amplification and larger rooms. Everything that a client might love about the Forest are fine tuned and magnified in the Signature version. The improvements, while evident, don't alter the classic characteristics.

Crossover: Forest's crossover components are excellent, but the Signature components are unparalleled in virtually any loudspeaker on the planet. The automotive equivalent of a turbo charged racing engine, it features Mundorf and Clarity MR non-resonant capacitors, ESA and Super Audio variants, Orange drop bypasses, oxide/metal foil resistors, and massive air core inductors.

Finish: Forest comes in mahogany, cherry, black ash, and satin white. Signature is available in unique, multi coat high gloss polyester mahogany, cherry, Dusk, and Ice that take a week to complete.

Decoupling: Forest is equipped with the Claw to control resonance. Signature features the Totem Decoupling System, including the Black Aluminum Skid Plate and Front Articulated Claw to adjust the angle of the for optimal phase response, bass loading and extension, and soundstage capability.

Ports: Forest uses PVC ports. Signature incorporates aluminum machined ports with intricate, precise shaping that allows us to shape and control the air flow turbulence for enhanced bass control and performance.

Connection Plate: Both use WBT connectors but those of the Signature are fitted into a custom machined annealed aluminum plate to further reduce resonances.

All these improvements have quantifiable effects like wider frequency response and greater power handling, but the true proof of Signature's superiority is best appreciated by listening.
